said town on Monday the twenty fourth Day of this Instant December
at two of the Clock in the after noon on said Day to see what Orders or
Instructions the town will give to the Select men to make the town
Rate also to see if the town will abate the widows of Mr. Daniel
Baley Rate of Bradford aforesaid Decies what he was rated last year
also to see if the town will give Instructions to the Select men
to order out of the treasures of said town six pounds thirteen Shillings
and four pence to pay the Schoolmaster's Wages for four months Schooling
and make Return hereof with your Names hereunto in the
Subscription at or before the time appointed for assembling
