 man or men as agents for y^e town at Ipswich Court
 also to hear a petition of Moses Gage Relating to a Road Crossing
 his Land to Metemahat River and act what the town shall
 think proper on that afore also to hear a petition of Andrew
 Hardy Respecting a road or way that goeth by his houses
 and to act what the town shall think proper thereon
 and make Return hereof with your Doings there in unto us the
 Subscribers at or before the time appointed for said meeting

 Cross Samuel Kimball and David Haseltine
 were Chosen Surveyors of highways
 John Marsh and John Day were Chosen Tything men
 Capt Benjⁿ Mulliken was Chosen Town Treasurer & Sworn
