

The feilal men considering the great hurt and damage
is done yearly by swine
Do therefore ordain that all swine above half a year old be
brought to the inhabitants of manor shall be sufficiently yoked
the yoke being two feet one nay in twenty inches the other
way on the y-crook of twelve years and how far they desert the
which is to be done by the first of agust next ensuing and for
to be kept yoked until the harvest (to be gathered) and unless
any horse less his yoke or be found unyoked before that time
the owners of them shall together with yoke them and if
any shall neglect to do his duty therein ^{he shall pay} within four weeks
next as aforesaid for every as they shall be found unyoked
the owners of such horse having been notified of things being
unyoked the one half to be paid to the manor and the
other half to the use of the town

We do also ordain yoked horse to go to the execution
of this ordain and to take notice of such owners of horse as
shall be found together withing to the great and shall give
notice of every such defect to one or more of the feilal men
within two days after any such person shall be found
delinquent to gether with the manor of horse that shall be found
unyoked ^{it was agreed by the feilal men of manor that every owner of horse}
^{so that the next about horse shall have six the second year}
if a farther default shall be made ^{in any horse} horse or manor to
in any horse shall the owners of such horse or manor shall
pay one shilling for the first offence and two shilling for the
second offence and for to days one shilling whoso until it

about such faults whereas they require be sufficient against one

hath taken to go into any street to be found in the streets
of manor without such shackle or fetters at any and take
stray them: the owners of them shall pay five shillings
any that shall impound them and for seven times a time
long as the horse is in the street
