 it was voted that Robert Bygottine and his annuall

 in need of for this year

was so ord that all persons that are noted against  
 feites both generall & particular within the Courne of moulton  
 shall be either a sufficient fine or rather fine well placid: all  
 of best three feet & ten further high with all other feites  
 to such a fine of five shillings for a yard & so onwards  
 that are appointed to be in force for the year the which  
 shall be made up by the first of April and for to be kept  
 by until the last of October & if any fine is found  
 within the said time the surveyors shall give notice  
 to the owners of the same together with a list of the  
 with respect to the same & the surveyors shall  
 find againe the same & the surveyors shall  
 find it sufficient for the year of the survey & if the  
 the owners & to one or more of the select men  
 shall forthwith by warrant impower the surveyors to  
 twelve years yet not more the year of that that are  
 sufficient for every sufficient set of fine and the surveyors  
 shall it up six shillings & if it be found sufficient  
 the owners shall pay 2 shillings for the year and for  
 twelve years yet not more than as it is found sufficient  
 surveyors giving notice to the owners every time they  
 sufficient & who to the select men who shall  
 chargeable to him the first & the surveyors shall  
 all the former with a list of the names of the  
 fine next & if they shall neglect to paye  
 according to this order they shall pay 2 shillings  
 for every defect they are convicted of by legall

At a legall town meeting at the inhabitation of moulton  
 march it was voted and granted that mister Simms  
 have forty acres of land layd out to him of that  
 land that hath at jndevz hill  
 morover Sergeant gage and John Simmans Dauid  
 was chosen to lay the forty acres of land for  
 the common land
