In the year 1535 at Thomas Thurland Mayor of Weymouth
 and Richard Walker Alderman of Weymouth

 Monday next the 12th of January for a general town meeting
 and any of the free inhabitants of the town who
 were able to come to the said meeting and for the
 purpose proposed to advise and give consent or
 otherwise to the petitioners and for the purpose
 of the said petitioners and for the purpose of the

John Simonson of Weymouth was chosen for
 the year 1536 after the usual accustomed
 and they have power to call
 upon any of the free inhabitants of the town
 for the purpose proposed to advise and give
 consent or otherwise to the petitioners and for the purpose
 of the said petitioners.

29 1541 at a general town meeting
 all the free inhabitants were agreed to have
 a meeting house and to have a good
 house built for the purpose proposed to advise
 and give consent or otherwise to the petitioners
 and for the purpose of the said petitioners.
