or inhabitants if found to engage in plea to stand by

take in himself provided he shall receive legal

At a general Town meeting January 1st 1677
It was taken upon for Constable Joseph Cole for 1/2 year Ensigning

It was taken upon for 1/2 year after in fine
occasions for 1/2 year

It was taken upon an Agree of 1/2 of Inhabitants that they
shall agree, which Inhabitants are by Court and bound
to make for 1/2 of wood in 1/2 of time, their number
shall be 1/2 of every year to be brought to 1/2 in fines
it or before 1/2 of year upon the penalty of ten shillings
per cord to be taken by Justice by warrant from 1/2 of
1/2 of Constable against that person or Inhabitant if
he doth not bring in his proportion according to town order and
the time shall be performed

It is further ordered that the town shillings, which is to be taken
for the default of not bringing each cord of wood
according to time as above mentioned, shall be 1/2 of 1/2 for
the man or men who shall be to take after 1/2 of fines
occasions, and are to provide the wood for their use that
the Inhabitants of Andover want not wood for his use
as they have 1/2 shillings for every cord they go to
provide for any 1/2 of wood and the other 1/2 of
shillings to be for the use of the Town
