there was voted that there 2. men that are yearly chosen
to go to m^r. Symis his bosons should hire men to bring his
hays from plomistland they hearing a mainthe warning and
and that they agree with the men to stay for there pay
pay w^{ch} m^r. Symis Rates be payed

It was voted that the select men have full power to fore
the meeting house: and also to Repair the meeting house

At a legal town meeting held in Bradford on the 23. of November 1703
Lasson Henry was chosen mediator first men were put to vote to read
the English men and the Indians when they com concerning the title
of one land nably. John Henry Joseph baby Richard Kembell son^s phely
attorned and John Keynton it passed in the afternoon the town gave
full power to act in the behalf of the town.

on the same day w^{ch} was put to vote how the Charges that might arise
on this account both in purchasing of the Indians if not w^{ch} and also the
Charges of the Comity should be defrayed it passed on the afternoon
that they should be layed upon w^{ch} mans property of
that lies in the bounds of the crown
