at the same time Left John Tenney and Left Richard Kumbull and Sars John Boynton were chosen a Comity to treat Mr Hale as a desire to his Contendure in this place and also to treat the Reverend Mr Syme to see what he would accept of his salary
this meeting on the 16: of August 1706: was adjourned until the 26: day of the same month: and then the meeting on the 26: day of August 1706: was a Council until the 17: day of September: 1706: it was then voted and should have for his salary for this year now Raising twenty pounds: in May and twenty and six pound in May one in year as many
Sixty and Six in all

at the same time Mr Philip Steward was made choice of to paye with the Comunity who were formerly chosen to treat with Mr Syme and Mr Hale namely Left Tenney and Left Kumbull and Sars John Boynton
