of the town: Jonathan Kembull was then chosen constable
for the west End of the town: for Select men was
then chosen Capt David Kerollino Lt Richard Kembull
Jusino Joseph Baly John Touchens and Jonathan woodman
for towne Clerk was chosen Richard Kembull
for shuyngmen wores chosen Robert Kerollino son: Philip
Attwood Thomas Kembull James palmer James Howitt
for Sueraires of highways and fences wores chosen Samuelt
stickney and thonus Baly: Thomas Gedon and J Chabod. beym
the towne did then Except of Robert Kerollino son for a
Constable In the Roome of the other 2: constables namly

2: it was then noted that for the preadigment of the Roumant
in Joseph Stuns if he shall soe caus. to satal with us in this
place that we will pay un to him yearly for the first tyer
the sum of sixty pounds as his yearly salary the one half in
mony and the other half in preuisan pay as many - - -
3: it was then noted that after the abovesaid Jones yones is
Expied thair then for the time to come so longe as the Roumant
in Joseph Stuns shall contonow with us in the worke of the
ministre in this place the towne will giue un to him as his
yearly salary the sume of Sixty and five pounds in the spracue
abovesaid thair not passed on the afoermitio - - -
4: it was then noted that the town would giue un to the Roumant in
Stuns the Improument of that parte of porsing belonging
to the town which is in present Improument which lyeth on
athre sid of the highway. this note passed on the afoermitio
5: it was then noted that the towne would yearly pay un to the Rou
in Joseph Stuns the sume of thirty pound. of good Sower was
noted on the afoermitio of the said m Joseph Stuns. Expied
