 Eighteen foot in breadth and seven foot high

It was then voted and passed on the affirming that the School
 house is to be set in the center of the Towne or near the
 meeting house as shall be thought fit

It was voted and passed on the affirming that the School
 house is to be built upon the Towne Costs and Charge

At a Legall Town meeting of the Inhabitants of the Towne
 of Bradford the 5 day of March 1713

Capt Richard Kimball was chosen moderator for the present
 meeting

It was voted and consented to that the Debt due to the
 Towne shall be paid by the Towne

 Towne when the Towne do hire a School master he shall teach
 School in three places of the Towne proportionally Equal for the
 Towne

It was voted and consented to that Capt Richard Kimball and Thomas
 Kimball and John Heseltine should be empowered to provide Rooms
 where the School may be taught at the End of the Year

It was voted and consented to when that Rooms can't be provided
 the Towne will build a house at the west End of the Towne
 and a house at the East End of the Towne for a School
