

At a legall Town meeting of the Libalnents of the town of Bradford held
 June the 27. 1715 Capt Richard Kimball Moderator
 it was then voted and passed on the affirmatives that the Towne would
 send to the quarter sessions at Salem to Desire them to send up a
 Committee in order to Change the Road at the west End of the Town
 by it was voted and passed on the affirmatives that Capt Kimball
 should go to Salem to the quarter sessions in order to make way that a
 Committee may be up

At a legall town meeting Oct. 6. 1715 Capt Kimball Moderator
 it was voted and passed on the affirmatives that the Towne would send
 a Committee to the west end of the town to see what they have to say
 about a Road to divide 2 it was voted and passed on the affirmatives
 that Capt Richard Kimball John Samuel David Clark Thomas Kimball
 should go and see and make Report to the Town
 2 it was voted and consented to that the present select men should
 provide the Town with a School Master to teach school till next
 Annual Town Meeting

At a legall Towns meeting by an a Town meeting November 1715
 Debts appeared to the Towns to Robert Mellickin for his
 Service being Constable
 for Constable Mellickin for what was due last year 00-08-00
 for marching the Country Rate 03-09-00
 for sweeping the meeting house 01-07-00
 for 3rd Representatives 08-00-00
 five Shilling for to by a book 00-06-00
 for Capt Kimball going to Salem 00-09-00
 for the select men 00-26-00

It was voted that Capt Richard Kimball and Mr John Hutehinson
 should appear at Salem Court as the Towns agents to lay before
 the Court the reasons that there should be a Road laid
 through Moses Deys land in answer to the year's petition at the
 Chong of the Towns order to make application to the Court in
 half of the Towns that divide Road may be cleared to
 Accomodate Neighborhood Rightly Entored as it was desired
 to me I being not present at that time

At a Town Meeting legall by warrid December the 5th 1715
 was and pass in the affirmatives that the Road the James Street
 have Grants Ten pounds this year in Grain at this prices
 following viz Indian at three Shillings per bushell and Rice
 at four and wheat at five
