and was then Legally Chosen: John Wood Constable for
the east end of the town: and Robert Kimball for the west
end of the town: and was then Chosen six select men: Deacon
Robert Kinselline: Thomas Carlton Deacon Richard Bally
Jes. Thomas Bally and Moses Day: and for surveyors of the
way: for the east end of the town: was then Chosen John
Pemberton: and Ezra Rolfe: and for surveyors of length was
then Chosen for the east end of the town Joseph Wood
and Caleb Hopkinson Surveyors of the way for the west end of
town: was then Chosen Joseph Hall and Amos Webster
and for fence warden for the west end of the town was then
Chosen Amos Webster and John Hall for tything men
for the town: was then Chosen Deacon Daniel Joseph Wood
Deacon Robert Kinselline Robert Mullinckins Jes. Francis Jarrish
Caleb Hopkinson: for hay reeve was then Chosen Jonathan
Sicouman: John Griffing William Carvory and James Gage
and for town clerk was then Chosen: Capt. Richard Kimball

All a legal Town meeting held the 13 of March 1722
it was voted that on the Second Tuesday of November yearly
that all parsons that shall happen to have any straws shall on 30th
bring them to the Town Clerk the marks of all such straws and there
to be kept by him that all that want may know whether to Repair
to be Informed

All John Wood that was Chosen in the 13 meeting held
March: 13 1722: of Constable select men tything men
Surveyors of the way or fence warden and hay reeve
were all sworn of the law Directly

All a Legal town meeting held April the 20 - 1722
Robert Mullinckins was Moderator it was voted and passed on
the Affirmative that the Swine should go all large
this present year
