To John Pemberton for keeping down gage - 12 - 0 - 0

To select men for making the prison tax - 5 - 4 - 0

To the schoolmaster for his fees - 36 - 0 - 0

As to the persons that boarded the schoolmaster
this year for on skilms for ovens

To the select men for making a valuation
of the estate three shilings and six pence per day for
each man

Resolved that the select men should lay the County
rate with an addition rate

Resolved the select men should Raise money and
lay it in the town rate to Repair the glass of
the School Houses at the above meeting was
