we the subscribers being Chosen by our respective Towns Newbury
and Bradford to perambulate the line between said Towns according
we met at the bounds are marked with N R and B which was the
Corner bound of Bradford and from thence to a large white oak
tree with a dead red oak by it from thence to a heap of rocks near
Beese Swamp
and on the north side of Beese Swamp
and then a red oak tree on the end of a hill in the wall and then to
two Hoping white oak trees in a wall and marked N B and then
to a black oak on a rock then to grate white oak tree by a swamp
marked with N B and then to a white oak stump with stones
about it and then to a great white oak tree up a knoll marked
with N B and to a heap of stones then to an Elm tree by the Swamp
side marked with N B and two young black oaks together and
then to a white oak stump with stones on the edge of an hill and
then to a black oak stump with stones at the northeast side of
a hill and to great white oak stump with stone about it and
then to a black oak tree in a fence from thence to a white oak
stump with stones about it by Bradford Road and then to
a stump in Nelsons hedge with stones and soe to meremack
River on the south side of a Creek Ralph Hale
