

at a legal Town Meeting held by the Inhabitants of that town  
of Bradford on the first day of May 1736 Cor John Mucklins  
moderator it was voted and allowed a road to be laid out  
through Joseph Kimball's Land for the Town's use for the  
space of ten years after this present year and that the town  
will be at the cost of the sales provided said Joseph Kimball  
will give sufficient security to the select men for the  
continuance of so road the above ten years it was also  
voted and allowed the same liberty to Leat Benjamin Melle  
kin that was given to Jeremiah Hichensy in respect of hanging  
of gals on the Town Road

March the 22 / 1737 at a annual Town meeting held by the Inhabitants  
of the town of Bradford for choyse of town officers was chosen Samuel  
Combs for the East End and Thomas Carlton for the west End of Stone  
Thomas Kimball Esqr moderator for select men was chosen Samuel  
Palmer Joseph Kimball Thomas Hickary & Benjamin Gage Samuel  
Wheather for a town Clerk was chosen Richard Burley for a town  
treasurer was chosen Benjamin Mucklins Thomas Kimball Esqr was  
chosen for assize of flax and hemp for severall of by ways was chosen  
Cor John Mucklins Samuel Hall Joseph Hardy & Joseph Hall Deacon  
Robert Hestleton and Jonathan Kimball for tising men was chosen  
Nathan Daily Edward Wood John Day & Nathl for fence  
wardens was chosen Ebenezer Sage Jacob Walker Jonas Platt  
John Hephinson for hog recte was chosen Phelp Henry Nathan Day  
Stephen Kimball Abraham Day for timber measures was chosen  
Jonathan Bailey Ebenezer Sage and Benjamin Sage it was voted  
the town should give at large this present year allowed to John  
Deus Richard Kimball and Samuel wheather five shillings apiece for  
inquering into the afore concerning the school house that was burnt  
at the west end of the town Deacon William Hardy and Leat  
Benjamin Mucklins was chosen and empowered to piceuse Robert  
Kimball unless he will make rationally satisfaction to the town for  
the damage they sustained in the lose of the school house that was burnt  
at the west end of the town deposing he was instrumental of the fact  
and Mr D Hardy and Mucklins was empowered to agree with Mr Robert  
Kimball about the afore said affare if they could and make there report  
of this for doing to the town the next Town meeting  
the above said officers were sworn to their respective offices
