At a Legal Town Meeting held by the Inhabitants of the Town of Bradford December the 15. 1746

Thomas Kimball Esq: Moderator voted that the petition of the Widow Samory be so far granted that thirty pound old tenor be raised and put into the treasury toward the Support of her Son Benj^a if needed and at the same meeting Mr. John Kimball was Chosen to provide the town with a Schoolmaster for y^r year

To Joseph Mulicken Constable you are hereby Required in his Majesty's name forthwith to warn y^e freeholders and other Inhabitants of said town Qualified for voting as the Law Direct: that they meet at the Best meeting house in said town on Tuesday y^e twenty fourth Day of this Instant at ten of y^e Clock in y^e forenoon to make Chorse of town officers for y^e year ensuing. also to see if y^e town will allow Swine to go at Large this year also to see if the town will Except of y^e alteration of y^e town Road as it is bounded out by the Select men: from william Hardy to y^e town Road that Come Down from Ebenezer Hardy to y^e Country Road: as also to see if y^e town will abate David Wood's Son Jonathan's Rate: & make Return of your So Doing to us y^e Subscribers at time and place
