of Ipswich with respect to Mr Phillip and his wife at Chancery
Court upon y^e agreement and to do what shall be thought
proper in y^e town's behalf

the Clock in y^e afternoon to see if y^e town will Chuse
a man or men to agree with y^e town of Ipswich for
keeping Mr Phillip and his wife as allso to see if the
town will agree with som body to fetch them back again
and allso to see if the town will Impower som man to
get a warrant to carry them to Haverhill and make
Reasonable Return of this warrant with your Joyns to us
