 Bradford October 9. 10. 1751 Thomas Savory Mider for said meeting

 Hopkinson to serve as a Constable in y^e Room of Benjⁿ Walenford
 and the vote passed in y^e affirmative & said ^{Hopkinson} was sworn to that effect
 it was put to vote whether the town will give Instructions to the
 Selectmen to sell y^e Schoolhouse in y^e East part of y^e town and
 the vote passed in y^e Negative. voted that thirteen shillings and
 four pence be raised to pay for y^e hire of a Schoolhouse in y^e
 East part of y^e town.
