At a Town meeting Legally warned December the 5 – 1715  
Voted and past in the afermitive that the Revn<sup>d</sup> Mr Symes Should  
Have Gratiss Ten poundse this year in Grain at these prises  
following viz Indian at three Shillings per bushill and Rie  
at four and wheat at five
