pound in Grain as mony and the Select men to Set the price of the
Grain yearly M^r Symes is answer
I Thankfully accept of the precedeing vote of the Town pasied march
13 : 1716 and in compliance with the proposal may the 14 = 1716 I
Chearfully promise that I Shant for the future Sell any wood or timber of the
persenage lanie Such as Stand where I have occasion to Clear th^e Land
