

At a Legall Town meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Bradford  
The 8 of Decem 1718 Capt kimball Moderater the Town hearing the  
memorial of the Committee that was Chosen for to tack Care that the  
School Houses Should Be built in Each End of the town

2 It was voted and passed on the affirmitive that the Town would pay  
twenty fouer pound twelve Shillings and Six pence Some time in January  
next insueing the Date here of and the other twenty fouer pound ten  
Shillings and six pence the next January twelvemonth for Building of  
S<sup>d</sup> School Houses

The Committee Anser to this vote of the Town know all men by these  
presents that whereas We David kimball and James Baily both of  
Bradford in the County of Essex in newengland ware agreed with by  
Robert mulickin and John Hutchings of the Same Town and County to  
build Tow Schooll Houses to teach persons in and we had obligations from  
the sd mulickin and Hutchings to have the sum of thirty two pounds  
money some time in January next Ensueing the Date hereof we do by  
these presents Declare that we Rest Contented and fully satisfied with  
the one half of the money we were to have for Building Sd houses this  
next January and to stay for the other half till next January follow  
Dated December the 8<sup>th</sup> 1718 as Witness our hands his

Know all men by these presents that I Rober David kimball  
kimball of Bradford in the County of Essex in mark  
newengland Do fully frely Declarey that the house James Baily  
Which is built in the West End of the Towne of Robert mulickin  
Bradford for to Teach School in that the S<sup>d</sup> Towne  
Shall have liberty to Improve the Same for the S<sup>d</sup> Servise  
So long as the S<sup>d</sup> house Shall Stand if it prove to be upon my Land  
as witness my hand Robert kimball

Caleb Hopkinson and for the west End of the Towne was Chosen  
Richard Haseltine Nathaniel Walker was Chosen Towne Clerk  
The Towne Exsepts of Robert mulicking Sener for Constable in the  
Room of Caleb Hopkinson juner  
Servayors of High ways and fences for the west End of the Towne  
was Chosen John Gage Sener and John Grifing and for the East  
End of the Towne was Chosen Samuel haile and william Savery  
for Titheing men was Chosen Joseph Hall John west ser Robert Haseltine  
Clerk Thomas kimball william Hardy juner John wood Sener  
All the above S<sup>d</sup> persons that were Chosen to offices for the year  
1719 were Sworn to a faithfull Discharge of their Respective offices
